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For the past six years, the Akelius Digital Language Learning (DLL) platform has been actively operating in Greece.

It focused primarily on aiding refugee and migrant children in grasping the Greek language through an interactive e-learning experience.

This joint effort between the Akelius Foundation and UNICEF strives to bolster language proficiency and self-confidence among refugee children, thereby easing their integration into the Greek school system.

Through a wide array of engaging activities, meticulously designed to be both multimodal and gamified, the platform sets out to enhance language comprehension skills, with a particular emphasis on both oral and written proficiency in Greek.

Employing a collaborative approach, the Akelius platform content undergoes continuous refinement, driven by feedback from teachers, implementing partners, and UNICEF education experts.

Over the span of six years, more than 7,000 teachers across Greece have received training to effectively utilize the Akelius platform.

As a result, this initiative has positively impacted over 19,500 users, who have actively engaged with the platform regarding their language learning needs.



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
